	OING DEEPER Read Ephesians 6:1-4. This passage starts by speaking to children about how they should treat both of their parents, but when it begins to address the parents it is directed at fathers. Why do you think that's significant?

3)	What do fathers need to do in order to bring up their children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord? How does a father's example play into this process?
4)	Read Psalm 78:1-8. Why is it important for fathers to make known the greatness and beauty of God in the home? What are some ways that can be accomplished?
5)	What are some ways to teach children the scriptures?
