ICE BREAKER

GOING DEEPER

- 1) What do you think is the difference between being broken before God and being broken by the hardships of life? Are there ways in which walking through times of brokenness be good for us?
- 2) Read 2 Corinthians 1:3-5. What are some potential benefits that we receive when we walk through trials and Christ brings us through safely? What potential benefits are there for people around us who don't know Christ?
- 3) Read Romans 8:28. What message does this verse carry for Christians who are suffering?
- 4) Read Mark 6:32-44. In what ways are our lives like the loaves and fishes in this story?
- 5) How should knowing that Jesus allowed His body to be broken for the sins of mankind affect us when it comes to evangelism?
- 6) What would you tell a brother or sister in Christ if they told you they would like to share Jesus with people, but their too afraid?
