Romans 12:1–2; 1:21, 28; Ephesians 4:20–24

ICE BREAKER

What do you think is the greatest invention in your lifetime and why?

GOING DEEPER

- 1) Read Romans 12:1-2. What does this passage tell us about God's will for our lives?
- 2) Romans 12:2 tells us that we shouldn't conform to the pattern of this world, but that we should be transformed. Why is it dangerous to avoid conforming to the world but never be transformed within?
- 3) According to Romans 12:2, how are we transformed? What does that mean?
- 4) Read Romans 1:21, 28. What is the relationship between our minds and our hearts? What does futile thinking lead to?
- 5) How does our mind war against us when we begin to pursue transformation through the Word of God?
- 6) What areas of your life would you like to see transformed? How does your thinking need to change in order for that transformation to begin?

GOD'S TRUTH TO REMEMBER

Romans 12:1-2 (ESV) - I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.
