Isaiah 43:18–25; Psalm 51:4

ICE BREAKER

If you could have an unending supply of one thing, what would it be and why?

GOING DEEPER

- 1) Read Isaiah 43:24. We know that our sin is destructive to our own lives, but how does our sin affect God according to this passage?
- 2) Read Psalm 51:4. According to this verse, against whom do we sin when we sin? Why is a sin against another human being really a sin against God?
- 3) Read Isaiah 43:25. This verse tells us that God is the One who has the power to forgive our sins. What is His motivation for forgiving us according to this verse?
- 4) Why is forgetting our sin something only God can do?
- 5) Read Isaiah 43:18. What does this verse tell us about how we should think about the past? Why is that important? Why do you think many people struggle with letting go of past sins and failures?
- 6) Read Isaiah 43:19. What principle can we learn concerning the outlook for our future from this verse?
