GOING DEEPER

- 1) Read Matthew 14:22. The disciples were in the storm because they were doing what Jesus told them to do. When you consider their situation and the experiences of other people from the Bible (like Job, Joseph, and Paul), what conclusion can you draw concerning the relationship between being in God's will and facing storms in life?
- 2) Read Romans 8:34 and Hebrews 7:25. What do these verses tell us about Jesus' activity in regard to His people today? How does this knowledge help us when we're in the midst of a storm?
- 3) Jesus didn't come to the disciples until the darkest hour of the night. What does this say about Jesus' timing when it comes to our storms?
- 4) When Jesus came to the disciples, he came walking on the waves of the sea – that which was causing great fear in their hearts. Pastor Dave said, "The thing that is the greatest storm in your life, Jesus keeps under his feet." What does that mean to you?
- 5) The disciples didn't understand what was happening when they saw Jesus walking toward them on the water. When it comes to storms in life, why is who you know more important than what you know?
