GOING DEEPER

- 1) Read Matthew 6:14-15. According to this verse, why is it so important for us to forgive other people when they sin against us?
- 2) Read Matthew 18:21–22. What was Jesus trying to communicate to Peter here? What can we learn from God's forgiveness of our sins about "keeping count"?
- 3) Read Romans 5:20. Is it possible to out-sin God's grace? Does that mean we can keep on willfully sinning since God's grace is greater than our sin? (*Hint: Read Romans 6:1-2*)
- 4) Read Psalm 19:13, Numbers 15:30, and Hebrews 10:26. What is presumptuous sin and why is it so dangerous?
- 5) How does forgiveness relate to the idea of canceling a debt? How does God handle the canceling of our debt in Micah 6:19, Isaiah 38:17, and Isaiah 44:22? What does that teach us about how we are to forgive others?
- 6) Why is accountability important when someone asks for forgiveness?
- 7) Read Matthew 18:28–35. What was the sin of the evil servant? How does understanding God's mercy toward us enable us to forgive others?

GOD'S TRUTH TO REMEMBER

Matthew 6:14–15 (NLT) - If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins.
