JOB AND THE WHIRLWIND

Job 1:20-21, 3:1, 11, 31:35-37, 38:1-6, 12, 17-19, 33-37, 40:1-2, 42:1-10; James 1:2-4, 17; Psalm 24:1; Proverbs 18:22; Proverbs 21:9; Genesis 50:20; 2 Corinthians 4:17; Romans 8:32; Jeremiah 29:13; 2 Corinthians 1:3-4; Romans 8:28

What is the best compliment you have ever received?

GOING DEEPER

- 1) Job lost all his wealth and all his children in one day. In Job 1:20-21, we read his response to these losses. What is your reaction to Job's response?
- 2) Read James 1:17 and Psalm 24:1. How do you think the truths in these scriptures help us understand Job's response to losing his wealth and his children?
- 3) Job's wife basically blamed God for Job's suffering and Job's friends blamed Job? Who was really the one who brought suffering into Job's life?
- 4) While it's true that Satan caused Job's suffering, it is also true that God allowed it. Why does God allow suffering in our lives at times? Is there a purpose to suffering? (*Hint: Read 2 Corinthians 4:17 and James 1:2-4*)
- 5) In Job 38-39, God asks Job a series of questions that Job is utterly unable to answer. What is the point God is trying to make to Job?
- 6) In Job 42:1-6, Job responds to God's series of unanswerable questions. How has Job's attitude changed from before his encounter with God?
- 7) Pastor Dave said, "God will not waste your suffering." Read 2 Corinthians 4:17 and Romans 8:28 and explain what that statement means in light of scripture.
- 8) Read Jeremiah 29:13. What does this verse teach us about continuing to pursue God in spite of any suffering we may be experiencing? What does this verse tell us about the result of seeking God with our whole hearts?
