ELIJAH AND THE VOICE

1 Kings 19:9–18; John 3:16; 1 John 4:10; Romans 5:8, 10; Deuteronomy 6:6–9

ICE BREAKER

What was the biggest surprise you've ever received?

GOING DEEPER

- 1) In 1 Kings 19:9-18, Elijah had fled from Jezebel after receiving a message in which she vowed to kill him. This passage finds him hiding in a cave. How do you respond when you're facing dark times?
- 2) Read 1 Kings 19:11-13. God comes to Elijah in the cave and tells him to step outside because the Lord was about to pass by. After three great displays of His power, how does God actually come to Elijah? What do you think is the significance of that?
- 3) When we are going through dark times, why is it so important for us to remember what God has done for us?
- 4) After God revealed his plan for Elijah, he had to make a decision to act on God's plan or to stay where he felt safe. What lesson does this teach us about moving forward in faith in God's plan for our lives?
- 5) Why can't we trust our feelings when it comes to following God? If we can't trust our feelings, what should the foundation for our lives be?
- 6) Read Deuteronomy 6:6-9. What has God done in your life and how can you set reminders around you to help you remain focused on God's faithfulness?

1 Kings 19:11-12 (NIV) - The LORD said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by." Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper.
